

State Funding Opportunities

Washington

The <u>Washington State Mathematics Council</u> offers an educator support fund where money is awarded money (\$50-\$500 per individual award) to support initiatives submitted by members. These funds can be used for professional development, attending mathematics conferences, building mathematics PLCc, or the purchase of instructional materials.

How ORIGO aligns with these educator support funds:

 MSMC member teachers can apply for these funds for professional development around ORIGO's core and supplemental mathematics curriculum.



<u>Learning Assistance Program (LAP)</u> is a state-funded program that offers supplemental services for K–12 students scoring below grade-level standard in English language arts (ELA) and Mathematics. These services focus on accelerating student growth to make progress towards grade level. Funds may be used to support ELA, math or behavior supports that improve academic readiness.

How ORIGO aligns with LAP:

ORIGO Education's supplementary learning resources are designed to support Tier 2 and Tier 3
intervention to help teachers develop students' mathematical understanding. These products have
also demonstrated research-proven effectiveness as intervention materials to accelerate student
growth.

ECEAP (Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program) serves children ages 3 – 5 from low-income families who meet requirements. The program works on kindergarten readiness including beginning skills for reading, math and science.

How ORIGO aligns with ECEAP:

 ORIGO Pre-K curriculum supports kindergarten readiness and achievement by aligning with early childhood mathematics standards. The Stepping Stone Pre-K curriculum students with researchbased core mathematics content that align with the goals of early childhood mathematics concepts and prepares them for success in kindergarten.

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Pre-K - <u>Title I, Part A</u> funds can be used to fund Pre-K learning opportunities at either a building level or targeted assistance level. These funds can also be used for the professional development of all those who work with eligible children in an early learning setting, along with Title II Title II, Part A funding.

- Additional funding exists to support targeted populations in Kindergarten readiness:
 - American Indians and Alaska Natives Under the Title VI, Part A Indian Education Grants to LEAs
 formula grant program, funds can be used for early childhood programs that emphasize school
 readiness; authorizes the use of grant funds to support preschool programs as long as those
 programs are effective in preparing children to make sufficient academic growth by third grade.
